Group Discussion	• A case or a group activity is given to the group of students.
(GD)	Students has to discuss & to come up with a solution.
Written Ability Test (WAT)	 2 questions are given to each student. Each question has to be written of 100-200 words. Total time given 5-10 mins.
Personal Interview	 it is a in persona interaction with the panel of the college
(PI)	the student is applying for

Now, Let's dive into the DTE CAP Process

Step	Description
1. Candidate Registration	Candidates register for participation in the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) 2021.
2. Filling Online Application	Candidates fill out the online application form for CAP 2021, indicating their preferences for courses and institutions.
3. Confirmation & Verification	Candidates confirm their online application form and undergo document verification and counseling, including brief group discussions (GD) and personal interviews (PI) at Facilitation Centre (FC).
4. Publishing of Merit Lists	Provisional merit lists are displayed, grievances are submitted and addressed, and final merit lists are published.
5. Display of Seat Matrix	Availability of category-wise seats (Seat Matrix) for CAP Rounds I, II, and III is displayed.
6. Option Form Confirmation	Candidates fill and confirm their online option form with preferences for institutes and courses before CAP Round I.
7. Provisional Allotment	Provisional allotment of seats for CAP Rounds I, II, and III is displayed, indicating the allotted institute and course.
8. Reporting & Acceptance	Candidates report to the Admission Reporting Centre (ARC) and accept the offered seat as per the allotment of CAP Rounds I, II, and III.
9. Establishment of FCs	The Directorate of Technical Education (DTE) sets up around 190 Facilitation Centres (FCs) in different MBA colleges of Maharashtra for DTE CAP 2021.
10. Seat Surrender	Candidates surrender seats to participate in the next CAP round with the aim of securing admission to a better MBA college.
