Hey! Everyone....Welcome to CATKing Family. I am here to guide you about MICAT. So, what exactly is MICAT?

MICAT (MICA Admission Test) is a national-level entrance exam administered by Mudra Institute of Communications, Ahmedabad (MICA). It serves as a gateway for admission to the PGDM-C (Post Graduate Diploma in Management Communications) and PGDM (Post Graduate Diploma in Management) programs. The exam is conducted twice a year, with MICAT I held in December and MICAT II in January.

Sections	Syllabus	
Psychometric test:	 It has 2 type of questions: ordinal options(Totally agree, somewhat agree, totally disagree) Candidates must try and answer all the questions asked in this section. Through the Psychometric Test, candidates' characteristics and behavioural traits are tested in the exam. The topics that are included in this section are: Personality traits Personality factors Situational judgements Behavioural patterns Life goals Career Goals 	
Descriptive Test	In this section of the exam, Descriptive questions are asked like essay writing, story writing as well as a passage arguing for or against a topic. Candidates will also get a set of pictures in the question papers from which they have to create a story. This section of the MICAT 2023 exam will evaluate candidates creative writing skills. To perform well in this section, candidates must develop a flair to write creatively.	
Divergent and convergent thinking	This section tests candidates' Reasoning Ability and questions are based on: Data Sufficiency Sequence and Series Statement - Assumption Visual Reasoning Word Association	
Verbal Ability	This section tests candidates' Grammatical skills and Vocabulary and questions are based on topics such as: Sentence correction Tenses Pronouns Synonyms and antonyms Fill in the blanks Analogies One word substitution Jumbled paragraphs and sentences Articles Idioms and Phrases Vocabulary English usage or Grammar Inference and Conclusion Reading Comprehension
