
- 1. Rule. Learned APP waives service of notice of Rule on behalf of respondent-State.
- 2. This application is filed under Section 439 of the Code Criminal Procedure regular bail in connection with F.I.R. No.11188008240015 of 2024 registered with Police Modasa Rural Station, District Arvalli.
- 3. Learned advocate for the applicants submits that considering the nature of offence and role attributed to the applicants, the applicants may be enlarged on regular bail by imposing suitable conditions.
- 4. The learned APP appearing for the respondent




State vehemently submits that the offences which have been charged, are serious in nature and looking to the facts as well as the allegations made against the applicants, no discretion is required to be exercised.

- 5. I have heard learned advocates appearing for parties and perused the papers investigation. From the record it that the investigation is over and Chargesheet has already been filed. As per the case of the prosecution, an attempt was made to set the victim ablaze and one of accused person had poured kerosene upon her whereas other tried ignite her to with matchstick. However, the victim did not suffer any injury as the attempt was successful. Having regard to the same, the present application deserves consideration.
- 6. This court has also considered the following aspects:
 - (a) As per catena of decisions of Hon'ble Supreme Court, there are mainly factors which required are to be considered by this court i.e. prima facie case, availability of applicants

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- accused at the time of trial and tampering and hampering with the witnesses by the accused.
- (b) That the learned Advocate for the applicants have submitted that the applicants Accused are not likely to flee away.
- (c) That the applicants are in custody since 11.01.2024.
- (d) The law laid down by the Hon'ble Apex Court in the case of Sanjay Chandra v. C.B.I. Reported in (2012) 1 SCC 40.
- 7. In the facts and circumstances of the case and considering the nature of allegations made in the FIR and without discussing the evidence in details as well as without going into details, prima-facie, this Court is of the opinion that this is a fit case to exercise the discretion to enlarge applicants on bail. Hence, the application is allowed and the applicants are ordered to be released on bail in connection with the on executing aforesaid FIR, a bond Rs.10,000/- (EACH)with one surety of the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court and subject to the conditions that;



- (a) shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the fact of the case so as to dissuade from disclosing such facts to the Court or any Police Officer or tamper with the evidence.
- (b) shall maintain law and order and not to indulge in any criminal activities.
- (c) shall furnish the documentary proof of complete, correct and present address of residence to the Investigating Officer and to the Trial Court at the time of executing the bond and shall not change residence without prior permission of the trial Court.
- shall provide contact numbers as well (d) as the contact numbers of the sureties before the Trial Court. In case of such inform change in numbers in trial writing immediately to the Court.
- file affidavit (e) shall an stating properties immovable whether self acquired or ancestral with description, location and present value of such properties before the Trial Court, if any.
- (f) shall not leave India without prior permission of the Trial Court



- (g) surrender passport, if any, to the Trial Court within a week. If accused does not possess passport, shall file an Affidavit to that effect.
- 8. The authorities concerned shall release the applicants only if they are not required in connection with any other offence for the time being. If breach of any of the above conditions is committed, the Sessions Judge concerned will be free to issue warrant or take appropriate action in the matter. Bail bond to be executed before the lower court having jurisdiction to try the case. It will be open for the concerned Court to delete, modify and/or relax any of the above conditions in accordance with law.
- 9. At the trial, the concerned trial Court shall not be influenced by the *prima facie* observations made by this Court in the present order.
- 10. Rule made absolute to the aforesaid extent.

 Direct service is permitted.
